18	year, provide to the City Council an estimate of the necessary appropriations to cover the expenses of				
19	each department and branch of the City government for the next fiscal year to be known as the "budget";

21	WHEREAS, the Mayor on June 14, 2013, provided to the O	City Co	uncil a Recommended Budget		
22	for the Fiscal Year beginning July 1, 2013, which is an estimate of the necessary appropriations to cover				
23	the expenditures of each fund, department and branch of City government, an estimate of the revenues				
24	from sources other than property taxation, including certain operating transfers, and an estimate of the				
25	amount to be raised by taxation upon real and personal property within the City of Burlington; and				
26	WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 157 of the City Charter it is necessary to adopt a budget and				
27	make annual appropriations for the Fiscal Year beginning July 1, 2013; and

	WHEREAS, it is now appropriate to make FY 2014 cost of living compensation adjustments for				
29	City employees who are not covered by a collective bargaining agreement;				
30	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Burlington, that said				
31	estimates of the revenues and expenditures shown, the schedules and accompanying narrative and tables				
32	of the Mayor's Recommended Budget, except for the Section titled "Regional Programs", are hereby				
33	adopted as the annual appropriation and budget of the City of Burlington for the Fiscal Year beginning				
34	July 1, 2013 (Fiscal Year 2014); and				
35	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that for the following programs and funds, library book fund,				
36	Parks & Recreation Special Projects, Burlington City Arts, Memorial Auditorium, 242 Main, ambulance				
37	billing, recycling, DEA Equitable Sharing drug forfeiture, Comprehensive Code Enforcement, all grants				
38	including Police and Fire Grants, all Special Revenue Funds, all Enterprise Funds, and all Capital Project				
39	Funds, the appropriations in the budget are not available for expenditure until a corresponding revenue				

amount is received or reasonably expected to be received; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the funds for capital improvements and capital projects may be expended only upon the transfer of all or a portion of such funds to comparable expenditure accounts by recommendation of the Mayor and with the approval of the Board of Finance or by this City Council; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the unexpended balances from the appropriations previously made for the continuing and existing grants and programs, general capital improvements, debt service reserves, central city computer, insurance reserves, and capital projects funds shall be carried over to the Fiscal Year 2014 Budget upon determination by the Chief Administrative Officer of the availability of such unexpended balances; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the full expenditure of "Designated Funds," including remaining small working capital bond funds, in the Fund Balance of the General Fund, shall not exceed the amount of the related revenues; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the employee positions and grade levels now authorized for Fiscal Year 2014 shall be as set forth in the Section titled Personnel Listing; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Council hereby agrees to make the following compensation adjustments for FY 2014 for all City employees not covered by a collective bargaining agreement that provides otherwise:

Compensation. Effective July 1, 2013, non-management employees not covered by a collective bargaining agreement that provides otherwise shall receive a 1.0% cost of living adjustment, based upon the change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI-U) for all Items-all Urban Consumers from April 1, 2012 to March 31, 2013, with a continuation of step movement;

AND, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no vacancy in any position shall be posted, advertised, or filled without advance approval of the Chief Administrative Officer and subject to appeal to the Board of Finance; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Community and Economic Development

Department is authorized to charge as a construction management fee up to 15% of total project costs to

offset construction management costs of Neighborhood Planning Association construction projects; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Administrative Officer may, from time to time, make expenditures, from the General Fund of the City, for the purposes of acquisition, construction and installation of certain capital improvements or other obligations. The City may intend that such expenditures, including but not limited to parking and terminal improvements at the Burlington

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that effective July 1, 2013, in order to increase the undesignated fund balance of the Water fund and reduce its reliance on the City's pooled cash, the water rate per hundred cubic feet shall be increased from \$3.33 to \$3.50; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, effective January 1, 2014, the monthly Stormwater rate shall be increased from \$1.17 per thousand square feet (/1000 sq. ft.) for commercial properties and \$3.00/1000 sq. ft. for single family homes to \$1.687/1000 sq. ft. and \$4.50/1000 sq. ft., respectively; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, effective July 1, 2013, the recycling rate charged to haulers by the Department of Public Works shall be increased from \$3.10 per RDU to \$3.35 per RDU.
