





TOTAL SYSTEM PARKS + OPEN SPACE

Burlington's Parks and Open Space

- Approximately 518 Acres of City Parks
 & Cemeteries
- 12.19 Acres per 1,000 Residents
- Parks are concentrated along the Lakefront and Winooski River Valley








INVENTORY PARK TYPES

PARKS INVENTORY


- 2013 Parks data updated through consultations with Client, site visits, GIS and other data
- Includes 32 total park spaces, designated by the City Parks Department

FACILITY TYPES

 Includes major facilities, such as Memorial Hall, Leddy Ice Arena, and the Miller Center

PARK ASSESSMENT

 Park elements compared against national standards and recommendations by consultant team











LEVEL OF SERVICE FIELDS AND COURTS







LEVEL OF SERVICE OTHER AMENITIES

























We had a great response rate


- Survey conducted by phone and mailing
- Random sample of 2,000 people selected
- 457 responses to date
- 95% level of confidence

CONNECTIVITY

Rethinking Park Access

- How can an abundance of regional park space be reimagined and better connect to help meet neighborhood park needs?
- Burlington has adequate total park acreage, but not all types or neighborhoods are well served.







CONNECTIVITY

TOP FACILITIES USED OVER THE PAST 12 MONTHS

- 1. Lake Views
- 2. Bike Paths
- 3. Beaches
- 4. Walking Trails

80% OF RESPONDENTS ARE SATISFIED WITH BIKE ACCESSIBILITY TO PARKS & FACILITIES.

TRAILS RANK HIGHEST (88%) IN NECESSARY FACILITIES, AND 86% SUPPORT CREATION OF NEW TRAILS.





CONNECTIVITY

Existing Connections

- Excellent connectivity along the waterfront bike path
- 48 miles of trails (34 public)
- Most of the city has access to a park within a 10 minute walk (limited access in wards 1+6)



MAINTENANCE OF BURLINGTON PARKS RANKS 2ND IN SERVICES THAT SHOULD RECEIVE ATTENTION. MORE ATTENTION IS DESIRED FOR THE NUMBER OF NATURE CONSERVATION AREAS, WHICH RANKED 5 T I-1 ON THE LIST.

52% SUPPORT RAISING TAXES FOR THE PARKS, TRAILS, AND RECREATION FACILITIES THEY VALUE THE MOST.
