This building was erected as the carriage house and barn for Edward Wells, who lived in the manscon at 61 Summit Street. It is located approximately on the same site as the original Edward Wells house built ca. 1877. The carriage barn was converted to apartments ca. 1926 when the building was purchased by Wm. T. Harrington. It plays a major role in establishing a picturesque street—scape along Harrington Terrace. It is also significant, as are other carriage houses, as an testimony to past transportation modes and needs.
